

Test / Evaluation of Questionnaire

As part of my project plan I have allowed time for testing and evaluating each major part of the project. This is the test and evaluation of the questionnaire part.

I have shown my questionnaire to 3 people and asked them to tell me what they thought of the design and how easy they thought it was to complete. I also asked them to tell me about any mistakes. I have put what they said below :-

- The testers liked the overall design but felt that it was too complicated for a questionnaire. I have listened to what they have said and reviewed my design. I agree that the design was better for use as a leaflet or possibly a website than a questionnaire. The tester said the use of so many colours would make the questionnaire expensive to print. My reviewer (ICT Teacher) agreed so I changed it and have reduced the number of colours and made it a lot simpler. This would make it cheaper to print and better for what it was meant to do.
- My testers also said that Question 2 had age 13 in both first and second choices and my reviewer agreed (ICT Teacher). Also the age range is too large and inappropriate as 17 and 18 year olds are not eligible for the make space club. The first is an error and I have corrected it on my final version of the questionnaire so that age 13 is only in one choice. The 17 to 18 year olds I have had to include as it was an instruction from DiDA on the website that I had to include certain questions and answers. If it wasn't for the instructions from the board I would have agreed with my testers and changed it.

- In question 4 my testers said the option to choose £3 as an amount willing to pay was duplicated in both choices 1 and 2. This is again an error I have changed the final version so that it follows the board instructions in the right way. The £3 option now only appears in choice 3 as below:-

- In question 5 some testers felt that some of the choices were unrealistic. Some felt that surfing and mountain-boarding were not possible in an area without Mountains or Dry Ski slopes nearby. Also there is no sea or suitable water features nearby on which it would be possible to surf. These were fair things to say as I had not read the course instructions properly and should only have included the 3 activities I was going to do. I have fixed this and now only give the 3 choices below: _

Feedback on Spreadsheet

Once I had designed and done my questionnaire I had to take it around my friends and family and ask them to fill it in.

I then created a spreadsheet to put the information into it.

Having done all that I asked my reviewer/ testers for feedback on the spreadsheet I had designed.

What they have said is below:-

- The first thing that my tester/reviewer noticed was that my spreadsheet was not like they thought it would be. When I asked them what they meant they said it was not like the design that was meant to be used from the DiDA website. On looking at the website better I saw that I had misread what had been expected and created my own design rather than following the design provided by DiDA. I accept that this was an error and my testers were right. This meant that I had to do it again only using the template from the DiDA website. This I did.
- After doing the spreadsheet again I gave it to my testers again. They said it did now look like the one on the DiDA website but I did not have any totals. I looked again at the design and as that had totals I changed the spreadsheet to include totals. Also the totals is a good idea is it meant I was then able to double check that I had got the right number of boys and girls.
- The reviewer told me that in several places my figures for boys and girls did not add up to the correct totals for boys and girls. I rechecked my figures and found that I had put the wrong figures in two places. I changed these to the correct numbers.
- The reviewer said that the font I had used was not consistent in all places as shown in the design. I reviewed the spreadsheet and made sure that I had used the set font of Arial Bold. I also checked I had used the correct size font.
- My reviewer also recommended that I put all my questions and results on the spreadsheet. I had only put the 7 questions shown on the design on my first draft. I agreed that it made sense to include all of the questions I had asked so added them in for the final version.

Feedback on Survey Results

Having got my spreadsheet right I then had to create some charts as it said on the DiDA website. I also did a couple extra ones of my own.

I then put the charts into the SURVEYRESULTS document as it said in the instructions. I then gave my SURVEYRESULTS file to my testers.

What they said is below:-

- They thought my charts were OK and that I had done the ones that I was meant to do in the instructions.
- They thought that I had used the right type of chart and they could understand them.
- The testers said that I should put titles on the charts so I went back and did that.
- My reviewer recommended that I made the background colour on my charts different from white. I agreed as it looked better and easier to tell which was the chart area. I changed them all to a yellow background as it helped the results stand out.
